



Introduction to Construction Trade Program Electrotechnology Focus

One of the key signature programs of the Construction Industry Training Board [CITB] is Dooways2Construction [D2C], an industry-supported secondary schools' program that provides career education and Flexible Industry Pathways [FIP] courses to attract students to a career in the Building and Construction Industry.

CITB has supported the delivery of programs within D2C for many years to provide students with exposure to various construction trades, especially those with low uptake of apprenticeships. CITB is now expanding their support for programs to assist students in making informed decisions about entering a D2C FIP course in building and construction and any other pathways supported by CITB by introducing **Introduction to Construction Trade Program**.

Fully funded by the Construction Industry Training Board [CITB] Grand Junction Trade Training Centre [GJTTC] is now offering students the opportunity to participate in a 3-day Introduction to Construction Program – Electrotechnology Focus. The students will spend one day engaging in hands-on experience to explore the Electrotechnology trade and the second day of the program will include learning and obtaining a White Card.

Introduction to Electrotechnology Program is designed to:

- > Assist students to achieve the VET Readiness [VETRO] requirements, by supplying a certificate of participation
- > Introduce students to career pathways in the Building and Construction Industry
- > Enhance students learning and increase exposure to trade areas that students may be unfamiliar with and that have low uptake of apprentices
- > Prepare students for entering a Building and Construction Flexible Industry pathways course such as the Certificate II in Electrotechnology [Career Start]
- > Establish and encourage links between schools, students and Registered Training Organisations

Special requirements: Students must adhere to all safety requirements as directed by their lecturer. The approved GJTTC uniform and Personal Protective Equipment will be required during all training. Students will need to purchase beige/black steel cap boots and tan work trousers before commencement at their own cost.

Location: Grand Junction Trade Training Centre, St Paul's College 792 Grand Junction Road, Gilles Plains [Entry via Gate 12 in Lurline Avenue].

Duration: 3 days. The program is delivered one day per week over 3 weeks.

Dates: 2 different start dates. Commencing:

- > Monday 14 October 2024 or
- > Wednesday 16 October 2024

Training Dates:

Group 1 – Mon 14 October, Mon 21 Oct and Mon 28 Oct

Group 2 – Wed 16 Oct, Wed 23 Oct and Wed 30 Oct

Time: 8:30am – 3:30pm

Price: All training is fully subsidised by the CITB. Please note there is a student management and uniform fee of \$50.

If a student has already completed the current Introduction to Construction Trade Program and wishes to explore Electrotechnology as a FIP option this Electrotechnology Taster is free.

Opportunity [total of students to enrol]: The program will be open to 30 students; 15 students in each group.

Accredited unit/s: Prepare to work safely in the Construction Industry – CPCCWHS1001 [White Card].
