From the Principal



Dear Families and Friends of St Paul's,

Our aim, as always, is to enable every student to reach their full potential and move on to whatever postschool pathway they desire. Baseline testing like these and others like NAPLAN assists greatly with this.

Students have also been on Year 8 geography excursions and the Year 12 Outdoor Education class has been on a surfing camp. Our summer season co-curricula program is also in full swing with hundreds of students and families enjoying the competitiveness of several

sports. These activities provide our staff and students with the opportunity to further develop positive relationships outside normal classroom situations.

The 2024 year has begun extremely well, and we look forward to building on these experiences throughout the year.

Smoking and Vaping - New Legislation from 1 March 2024

From 1 March 2024, new legislation bans smoking and vaping in a variety of public outdoor areas in SA. CLICK HERE to see an overview and HERE for more information. While the College is already a smoke-free site, members of our community should note that this will now be legislated:

"The new laws will create smoke and vape-free outdoor areas in all public areas: at early childhood services premises, and education and children's services facilities (including schools), and within 10 metres of their boundaries."

From 1 March 2024, it will be unlawful for anybody to smoke or vape on our College site and within 10 metres of our College boundary. This always applies to all people, irrespective of whether it is school hours, and whether young people are present or not.

Members of our community, including external clubs and associations, are advised of the need to refrain from smoking or vaping at all times, in and around our College.

From the Primary Years



Dear Families,

At St Paul's College we believe that wearing the full and correct school uniform is an extremely important and integral feature of our college community. The uniform symbolises identity and unites all students equally and instils a sense of pride and belonging to St Paul's. Wearing the correct and full school uniform assists in developing self-respect, self-discipline and care of oneself. It also reflects the values and attitudes held within our college community and provides structure and routine in attending school. The uniform also reflects an image of the college in the public forum.

When parents and carers enrol their child at St Paul's, they agree to abide by the rules and procedures of our college. Adhering to the college's uniform policy is, therefore, a parental responsibility taken on as part of acceptance as a member of the school community.

I would like to congratulate our students on the settled and calm start they have had to 2024. Our teachers are running Morning Circle each day which is a great way to check in and out, frame expectations for the day or upcoming lessons and nurture meaningful relationships, within the Learning Community, in a safe manner. The positive primer leaves them feeling energised and ready to learn. It also helps to build predictable routines. It allows the class to set the tone for the day, highlighting positives. Teachers then finish the day, by giving everyone the opportunity to reflect and share something they've enjoyed – What Went Well (WWW).

When you see your child for the first time after school, ask them, "what went well with your day?" It sets them up to share positive and happy emotions and is also a great conversation starter at dinner time.

NAPLAN testing will occur in our Primary Years between 13 and 25 March 2024 for students in Years 3 and 5. Online NAPLAN tests provide more precise results and are engaging for students. The tests are tailored, or adaptive, which means that each test presents questions that may be more or less difficult depending on a student's responses. This helps students remain engaged with the assessment.

Tailored testing allows a wider range of student abilities to be assessed and measures student achievement more precisely. A student's overall NAPLAN result is based on both the number and complexity of questions they answer correctly. Your child should not be concerned if they find questions challenging; they may be taking a more complex test pathway.

All Year 3 students will continue to complete the writing assessment on paper.

NAPLAN provides valuable information to schools and parents about Literacy and Numeracy achievement. It supports school improvement processes by enabling teachers to monitor student progress over time and to identify areas of strength and development.

All eligible students are encouraged and supported to participate in NAPLAN testing. Visit www.nap.edu.au to see interactive versions of the test and for more information.



Shrove Tuesday and Ash Wednesday

On Tuesday 13 February, the Primary Years celebrated Shrove Tuesday by enjoying a pancake morning tea. Shrove Tuesday is the last day before the Christian time of Lent. The 40 days before Easter is known as Lent (We don't count the Sundays). 












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
