

EREA Pilgrimage - John Grave

Over the Term 3 holiday, I had the incredible opportunity to travel to both India and Ireland with 13 education leaders from EREA schools across Australia. The pilgrimage was led by EREA Beyond Borders. The focus of the pilgrimage was to visit, connect and learn from Edmund Rice schools and communities across both countries.

In India, I had the pleasure to visit 4 schools: St Joseph's College, St George's Free School and St Mary's College all in Kolkata and St Columba's in New Dehli. In Ireland, I visted a number of schools in Cork, Waterford and Dublin. Two of which were co-education schools and had a very similar feel to St Paul's College.

What was clearly recognisable in all the communities we visited were the shared values and practices of the Edmund Rice Charism. There are 288 Edmund Rice schools and flexi-schools worldwide. At St Paul's College, we are an important part of the Edmund Rice story and we belong to a strong and vibrant community across the world. This is a point that will be promoted within St Paul's over the coming weeks.

The trip also allowed me to learn more about Edmund Rice. A very spiritual man who used his business talent to generate significant wealth, despite the strict penal laws preventing Catholic children from an education. He was a spiritual man who had to overcome a number of dark and troubling times in his life. He was reared in a family that provided great hospitality to the underprivileged. This was the basis of his work in establishing both the Chistian and Presentation Brothers and providing education, food and clothing at the first schools established. He was influenced by strong and successful women like Nano Nagle and Mary Power to action his beliefs to help the marginalised in his society.

I am grateful for the opportunity I had to experience the hospitality of the Edmund Rice communities in both India and Ireland and I recognise the work and outreach that the St Paul's community are doing within our local community.
