Dear Families,

What a wonderful fortnight of learning and connection we have had in the Primary Years. It is such a privilege to walk through the classrooms and see the children engaged and ready to chat about their learning.

Years 3 and 5 students participated in the annual NAPLAN testing and we were so proud of their resilience, persistence and, for some, enthusiasm in sitting the different tests. NAPLAN is one aspect of gathering data on students' Literacy and Numeracy skills. The data comes out later in the year and is one of many modes of assessment that is used to help inform the Teaching and Learning experiences of our students.

All classes from Reception to Year 6 also participated in National Simultaneous Storytime (NSS) this week and the Primary Years was abuzz with excitement! NSS promotes the value of reading and literacy and exploring the fun of books, not only locally and nationally but

across the world. The students worked in cross-age groups with different teachers on varying activities. They read the book "The Family Tree" written by Josh Pyke and illustrated by Ronojoy Ghosh, then made bookmarks, butterflies, gumnut pictures, magnets, nature paintings and find-a-words. There were even some mathematical activities, more reading and meditation. If you haven't had the chance, take the time to ask your children about their chosen activities. It's always a great way to hear what they are doing at school and find out how much they enjoyed it.

Finally, I attended a very spiritual and moving Reconciliation Liturgy where both Primary and Secondary students gathered in the chapel and were prepared beautifully for Reconciliation by Kristynn Ross and the Catholic Identity team. Fr Matthew presided over the celebration and there was such a sense of calm and reverence in our chapel. It was also so lovely to see families able to attend and support their children at this special time in their Faith journey.
