Students are required to ensure their laptops are fully charged, bring their chargers with them to testing, and complete any software updates the night before testing.

International Women's Day (March 8) is a global day celebrating the social, economic, cultural, and political achievements of women, while also shedding light on issues such as gender equality, reproductive rights, and violence and abuse against women.

St Paul's College has a strong professional learning community of teachers who work in a collaborative culture of high expectations. Our teachers engage in weekly professional learning outside of their teaching workload, that is pivotal to our continued growth as a Primary Years and as a profession. At times our staff attend professional learning opportunities to build their capacity in an area they may be leading within the college, or a focus that supports our college's strategic directions. This may occur during the school day. At all times, school teaching and learning programs continue with the teacher that we have employed for the day.

Mrs Samantha Hankes, our Head of Wellbeing, recently took our Year 6 student ambassadors to the Halogen leadership conference, a fabulous opportunity for them to connect, be inspired and see the endless possibilities of what they can achieve.

A reminder that NAPLAN commences next week, for students in Years 3 and 5. This is one set of tests at one point of time. We encourage our students to do their best. As parents, if you can ensure they are at school with plenty of time, have had good quality sleep and the equipment they need (fully charged device) then this helps so much with them feeling prepared for the days. You know your child best so consider the positive conversations you can have at home that will support them.

As a college, we teach students about the appropriate use of their devices, and parents sign a contract supporting our college to monitor the proper use of devices and home monitoring.

To support the children in our care, St Paul's College:

- Educates students of the dangers of inappropriate use of the internet
- Monitors the use of any form of ICT in normal school hours and the use of the school email system at all times, and will deal with anything deemed inappropriate
- Refers anything that we believe could be defined as, or could potentially lead to a Child Protection issue, to the appropriate external agencies
- Supports parents with advice on how to tackle inappropriate use either by their own child or others

Just like their interactions in person, online interactions require supervision and support from families. What is deemed appropriate, will vary from family to family but the strategies we expect of families include:

- Closely monitoring your child's use of devices for the apps that are downloaded
- Enacting parental controls with your internet access at home
- Reviewing the messages they send on platforms and apps making monitoring part of a daily or weekly routine
- Setting expectations about which space, preferably communal and not in bedrooms, and also the times they have access to devices
- Encouraging them to share or discuss with you what they are doing

We take these matters very seriously and by working together, I trust that we can keep our students safe and protected.


